INSTRUCTIONS

Artist information

Name of artist: Research the artist's background, including their education, training, and career highlights.

Reputation: Evaluate the artist's reputation in the art world, including any awards, exhibitions, and critical reviews.

Provenance: Confirm the artwork's history of ownership and ensure it has a clear and documented provenance.

Signature/Marks: Verify the artist's signature or any distinguishing marks that authenticate the piece.

Artwork details

Alternate titles: Note the title and any alternate names the artwork may have.

Personal considerations

Tax advisor: Discuss potential tax implications with a tax advisor.

Legal considerations
